Sonoma Valley Fund Announces 2011 Ellman Grants

June 17, 2011 — The Sonoma Valley Fund announced today that this year's George and Phyllis Ellman grants, totaling \$37,000, will be awarded to six Sonoma Valley non-profit organizations in support of projects fostering environmental awareness and specific environmental improvements.

A seventh grant to the Sonoma Classical Music Society supports classical music performances in Sonoma Valley, a particular interest of Mr. and Mrs. Ellman.

The 2011 Ellman/Sonoma Valley Fund grants will enable a go-ahead on two projects supporting environmental restoration and improved public access. They are trail improvements and creation of new seasonal wetlands at Bouverie Preserve in Glen Ellen; and, improvements to two new scenic overlooks along the Loop Trail at Sonoma Land Trust's Glen Oaks Ranch.

The Ellman's generosity will also support the Sonoma Community Center to create a new Center for Sustainable Living. This project will encourage conservation, organic farming and farm-to-table cooking and the construction of an outdoor learning center.

In the area of environmental education and awareness, Ellman/Sonoma Valley Fund grants will permit Landpaths to continue to engage third grade students at Flowery Elementary School in its "In Our Own Backyard" program of field-based environmental activities and grassland restoration projects; Quarryhill Botanical Gardens to reach out to Sonoma Valley youth of all

backgrounds with its outdoor curriculum designed to increase understanding and appreciation for the natural world; and the Sonoma Valley Ecology Center to continue its K-12 Watershed Education Program which provides hands-on, bilingual science and outdoor experiences to some 1,100 students annually.

"Thanks to the foresight and generosity of George and Phyllis Ellman during their lifetime, these key environmental and music programs in Sonoma Valley will continue during the coming year," said Maggie Haywood, Chairman of the Sonoma Valley Fund Ellman Grants Committee.

"Their love of Sonoma County, expressed in their gift, leaves a legacy that will long be remembered by all of us."
